

Modern Slavery Act - Transparency Statement

This statement sets out Total Glass Limited actions to understand all potential modern slavery risks related to its business and to put in place steps that are aimed at ensuring that there is no slavery or human trafficking in its own business and its supply chains'

Total Glass is a manufacturer and supplier of UPVC and aluminium products to the construction and building trade, based in Merseyside.

Total Glass group recognises the importance of taking action to combat modern slavery and human trafficking. We are also committed to continuous improvement of our processes to tackle slavery and human trafficking.

We source a large majority of our goods and services from UK and European Union suppliers, in which regions modern slavery is not prevalent, but we recognise that certain goods/services and the countries from which they are sourced, 'may carry greater risk'

We operate a strict supplier selection process and have a close knowledge of key suppliers with whom we have long-standing relationships.

We continually review our existing compliance and risk management process. This will determine associated risk, detection and prevention of modern day slavery and human trafficking within our supply chain for products and services to the Company.

We have in place systems to encourage the reporting of concerns by employees and the protection of whistle blowers.

Our attitude to modern slavery and human trafficking is zero tolerance and we expect all those in our supply chain to comply with our values.

If a supplier is found to be demonstrating unacceptable practices they will be investigated and provided with guidance regarding immediate required improvements.

If no improvement is implemented or they indicate an unwillingness to cease unacceptable practices they will be reported to the appropriate authorities and ultimately trading with this supplier would cease.

This statement is made to comply with the transparency provision of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 (section 54(1)) and constitutes our slavery and human trafficking statement and has been approved by the Group's Board of Directors, who will review and update it annually
